Treasurer Report (for year ending 31st December 2023)



The group's accounts have been produced according to the requirements of the Scout Association and the Charity Commission and have been inspected and approved by the trustees of the group and an independent examiner.

The group has had another good year financially, the total income has increased compared to 2022. This is due to the group being able to fulfil a full programme of activities.

Membership was set at £30 per term for the year for the first time since 2019. Our membership levels have remained stable, and we had very little movement from prior years on expenditure. Rent, insurances, utilities at the hall have remained approximately the same as the previous year. The main increase in expenditure compared to 2022 was due to the need to repair the toilets and boiler in the year.

Unfortunately, there was no fund raising during the year, this is something that as group we need to actively look at.

Group funds remain healthy, with a budget set for 2024 which will allow continued expenditure towards the running of the hall, group equipment and Scouting activities.

Running the Scout Section is made all the more easier with the fantastic set of Leaders that we have... They each bring their own skills and enthusiasm into developing, organising


